


## The Holy, Glorious, All-Laudable Apostle Philip One of the Twelve Apostles

## The Holy, Glorious, All-Laudable Apostle Philip Presentation Summary

<u>Born:</u> Bethsaida in Galilee <u>Died:</u> Hierapolis in Phrygia

Accounts of the Apostle Philip begin when he first became a disciple of Jesus

- · Recognized Jesus as the Messiah immediately
  - o In part attributed to St. Philip's knowledge of the Old Testament
- Witnessed the Feeding of 5000 (Miracle of the Fish and Loaves)
- Present at the Last Supper and in the Upper Room

Preached the Gospel primarily in Asia Minor and the surrounding regions, performing numerous miracles during his travels

- Galilee
  - o Brought an infant back from the dead that died in its mother's arms
- Greece
  - o Was sentenced to death by stoning by the high priest of the pagans
    - High priest and his cohorts were struck blind when they tried to attack St.
       Philip (multiple documented endings)
      - Some accounts say St. Philip healed their blindness
      - Others say the earth swallowed up the attackers
- Parthía
- Azotus
  - o Healed an eye affliction of the daughter of Nikoklides
    - Nikoklides' entire family was then baptized
- Hierapolis (Syria)
  - o Healed the hand of a city official after it was withered for trying to strike St. Philip
  - o Restored a dead child to life
  - o Established Heros as bishop in Hierapolis
- Hierapolis (Phrygia)
- Defeated a serpent god through prayer that the pagans were being bitten by Crucified upside down in Hierapolis in Phrygia
  - Judged and sentenced to death by the governor
  - The earth swallowed up his judge and man pagans at the crucifixion site
  - Converted locals tried to save him, but he reposed by the time they could help
  - St. Philip was buried by his sister, Marianma, who was traveling with him

Marianma continued to preach the Gospel in Armenia and other regions Tomb excavation finished on July 26, 2011
